## Recessional

# **REGALIA**

The tradition of wearing academic regalia in the United States and Canada dates back to the first universities in Europe, founded in the 12th and 13th centuries. Academic robes, hoods, and caps have evolved over time.

In the United States, caps and gowns have been used since colonial times. In 1885, a widespread student movement in America pushed to wear caps and gowns at commencement ceremonies. In British Columbia, academic dress began to be adopted in the mid-19th century and, over time, a full range of gowns, hoods, and headdresses was prescribed and worn by officers and graduates of higher learning.

By 1894, colleges and universities across North America began standardizing the style and colours of robes and hoods. All robes were black and the lining and border colour of the hood differentiated faculties and academic institutions.

# **ACADEMIC COSTUME**

An academic costume describes the academic origin and accomplishments of the wearer. Holders of bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees are recognizable by their costume, and the trained eye may identify the university that conferred the degree, as well as the individual's field of learning.

The shape and decorations of the gown designate the highest degree earned by an individual. The master's gown has an oblong sleeve, open at the wrist or upper arm; the rear part of its oblong shape is square cut. The doctoral gown may be readily identified by the velvet facing down its front and by three velvet bars on each sleeve.

Master's degree holders wear mortarboards with a tassel noting the year of their graduation. The tassel may also be colour-coded according to the degree program. Doctoral degree holders can wear tams (as worn by our Chicago Campus graduates) or beefeater caps (as worn by our Vancouver Campus graduates).

The hood is an important and distinctive feature of academic pageantry. The master's hood is three feet long with a three-inch edge. The doctoral hood is four feet long with a five-inch edge. The colour of the hood's velvet edge represents the field in which the wearer earned his or her degree and the inner lining showcases the official academic colours of the institution that conferred the degree. Adler University graduates from the Chicago and Online campuses, for example, wear linings that are burgundy and gold. Graduates from the Vancouver Campus wear linings that are orange, green, and brown.

# GRADUATE SPEAKER: ALISON MCCLEARY, PSY.D.

Alison McCleary, Psy.D., was born and raised in northern British Columbia, which she credits for her distinct passion for serving rural communities. Prior to pursuing her Doctor of Psychology in Clinical Psychology, Dr. McCleary completed her Master of Counselling Psychology at the Vancouver Campus and, for several years, ran a counselling practice in her hometown. Those experiences expanded her skills by directly serving the residents of her community and supervising other graduate students from Adler.

To further her goals in serving rural areas, Dr. McCleary returned to Vancouver to earn her doctorate. Dr. McCleary has a long-term dream of developing a doctoral internship site that provides treatment and assessment services to historically underserved areas in northern B.C. She also secretly hopes she can use the beautiful scenery, small-town living, and unique professional opportunities to entice psychologists and other mental health professionals to stay in the north.

In addition to her clinical work, Dr. McCleary co-hosts the podcast "Edge of the Couch." The program allows Dr. McCleary to practice creativity and lean into another of her passions — working with students and emerging therapists.

When Dr. McCleary isn't working or studying, she enjoys spending time with her three pets, exploring the outdoors, and reading historical fiction.

# COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER: DANNY RAMADAN

Danny Ramadan is a Syrian-Canadian author, public speaker, and advocate for LGBTQ+ refugees.

Prior to coming to Canada in 2014 as a refugee, Ramadan conducted underground work to support and provide housing to other queer Syrians. He has continued that effort in Vancouver by creating An Evening in Damascus, an annual fundraiser that aims to assist other LGBTQ+ Syrian refugees and offer them a safe and dignified passage to a new home in Canada. Since 2015, it has raised over \$300,000 for Rainbow Refugee Society, which aids in the safe arrival of refugees from across the Middle East and North Africa region.

For his activism, Ramadan was named among the Top Immigrants to Canada in 2017, and he received the Mark S. Bonham Centre for Sexual Diversity Award for Excellency. He was also sainted by the Vancouver Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence and given the title Saint Guiding Light to Sanctuary, New Home and Safety.

In addition to his advocacy work, Ramadan is an award-winning author whose latest novel, The Foghorn Echoes, recently won the Lambda Award for Gay Fiction. His 2017 novel, The Clothesline Swing, has been translated into multiple languages. He is known for his TED Talk, The Refugee Tree, which was filmed in Vancouver in 2016. In it, he shares his intimate experience of uprooting himself from his homeland to flee from homophobia and the challenges of arriving in a new country as a refugee.
